

Contemporary Dance Performance "HIBIKI" by Sankai Juku

Sankai Juku, one of the most well-known Butoh companies was founded in 1975 by artistic director. Ushio Amagatsu. He has premiered a new piece on a constant pace, approximately once every two years, at Théâtre de la Ville, Paris, the place for his creation and work. Since 1982, he has created successively **Jomon Sho** (1982), Netsu no Katachi (1984), Unetsu (1986), Shijima (1988), Omote (1991), Yuragi (1993), Hiyomeki (1995), Hibiki (1998), Kagemi (2000), Utsuri (2003) and Toki (2005).

HIBIKI is one of internationally acclaimed pieces of Sankai Juku, and an award winning work of unparalleled simplicity and poetic beauty. It was world-premiered at Théâtre de la Ville, Paris in December 1998 and has received high reputation from many countries in the world. It was performed in May 2001 at Sadler's Wells Theatre in London, which is known as one of leading theatres for contemporary dance in U.K.. The following year, HIBIKI won the 26th Laurence Olivier Award in category of Best New Dance Production, the most prestigious prize of performing arts in U.K.

This powerful and famous Sankai Juku has performed in 40 countries and visited more than 700 cities. It is a golden opportunity for Malaysians to see the fascinating performance by Sankai Juku for the very first time.



KUDAN Project Production "YAJI and KITA"

In early November, The Japan Foundation, Kuala Lumpur proudly brings KUDAN Project Production - "YAJI and KITA", praised as a totally new theatre experience, which encounter of talent from two different genres, comic and theatre. "YAJI and KITA" is based on a comic book called "Mr. Yaji and Mr. Kita in Deep" written by Kotobuki Shiriagari. The work is taken from one of the most important pieces of Japanese classic literature, "Tokai Dochu Hizakurige", which was written by Juppensha Ikku two hundred years ago (in the late Edo era).

The KUDAN Project, which is active mostly in Nagoya, was founded in 1998 by Tengai Amano (playwright and director) and Hideji Oguma (actor and producer). It consists of actors and crew from various renowned theatre groups and freelance artists. By combining high techniques of numerous groups and different genres, the project pursues a wider possibility of theatre arts.

This time, KUDAN Project visits Manila and Kuala Lumpur for the very first time with "YAJI and KITA", which was first performed in 2002 and it has gained popularity in and outside Japan.

KUDAN Project is supported by Agency for Cultural Affairs, Japan.

Synopsis:

YAJI and KITA leave Edo to visit Ise Shrine, hoping to find something real in this world. They stopped by rain at a small inn. As the persistent rain lasts for days, endless ideas start to fill their mind and they waver between fantasy and reality.

When time and space of reverie get entangled, YAJI and KITA become unsure of whether they left Edo or not and nightmares of the two unfold with humor and absurdity.



- Asian Environment Issue

Since 1995, the Japan Foundation has been holding The Asian Cartoon Exhibition, employing a friendly medium of cartoons for introducing Asian societies, cultures, and people's ways of life from various perspectives.





The 11th Asian Cartoon Exhibition - "Asian Youth Culture"



In response to popular demand to continue the cartoon exhibition of 2005 in the same manner and format, Japan Foundation requests 10 cartoonists from various Asian nations including Japan to produce cartoon works on common theme "Asian Youth Culture". A total of 80 new works will be made for exhibition in Japan and Asian countries. This set of original works will take part in travelling exhibitions to be staged in Japan and Asian countries over two and half years. The purpose of this exhibition is to further stimulate and deepen understanding about societies, cultures, and other aspects of Asia, thus the Japan Foundation have been holding this exhibition every year in Tokyo, as well as conducting a travelling exhibition throughout Japan and Asian countries.

Ten participants cartoonists of Asian nations (Bangladesh, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, The Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Vietnam) working on the leading edge in their respective nations will highlight aspects of their nation's youth culture.

The exhibition will be held from 27 October to 8 November at O Art Museum in Tokyo.

Four among exhibiting foreign cartoonists will be invited to Japan for 6 days, from 26 to 31 October 2006 to participate in a symposium joined by Japanese cartoonists and others. The symposium will be held at Conference Hall of The Japan Foundation.





Cartoonist Mohd Tazidi Bin Yusof, who representing Malaysia contributed 8 works and also will be invited to Japan as one of the four Asian cartoonists to participate in the symposium.

He was born in 1959 in the Royal Town of Kuala Kangsar, Perak. After obtaining his Malaysian Certificate of Education, he contributed his cartoon works to FANTASI and BAMBINO magazines and later became a full-time cartoonist / Head Artiste for GILA-GILA. In 1988 he received the Best Selections Award from Philip Morris Art Competition. He is now Creative Director of an event company. Craftmen Soliloquy Company Limited.



KOBUDO Demonstration - Traditional Martial Arts of Japan

KOBUDO, which means old martial art in Japanese, is the most authentic and genuine source of traditional technique and inspiration of Japanese martial art from Ninja to contemporary JUDO.

Recently, the Japan Foundation organised two successful KOBUDO demonstrations, in Kuala Lumpur and Malacca.

About 160 audiences range from VIP, martial art members, students and public attended the demonstration in Kuala Lumpur. YAM Tunku Tan Sri Imran Ibni Tuanku Jaafar, President of OCM and IOC member, The Hon. Delia Lawrie, Minister for Family Community Services and Minister of Sports, Northern Territory, Australia and her delegations, Y. Bhg. Datuk Sieh Kok Chi, Hon. Secretary of OCM and Mr. Shimoyama Masaya, Director of The Japan Foundation together with other prominent people witnessed the KOBUDO Demonstration which was held at OCM Indoor Sport Arena, on Monday, 14 August 2006.

In conjunction with the KOBUDO demonstration in Kuala Lumpur the Japan Foundation took the opportunity to make a goodwill donation of 109 wheel chairs from Disable Union of Okayama Prefecture Tsuyama Branch donated to Malaysian Paralympics Council. Mr. Sakate Masao represents President of Disable Union of Okayama Prefecture, Tsuyama Branch, and Mr. S. Radha Krishnan represents Malaysian Paralympics Council in the ceremony.

While in Malacca, the demonstration was attended by more than 500 audiences, mostly school students. It was held at Mahkota Parade, on Tuesday, 15 August 2006. Many shoppers and enthusiasts' onlookers came to see the demonstration as it took place at a shopping centre.

KOBUDO demonstrations was done by 8 demonstrators from the most famous among the oldest school in Okayama, Takenouchi-ryu or Takenouchi School, which was initiated in 1532.

The demonstration in Kuala Lumpur was jointly organized by The Japan Foundation, Olympic Council of Malaysia (OCM), Okayama prefecture and The Ministry of Youth and Sports. In Malacca, the demonstration was co-organized with the Malacca State Karate Association and the Malaysian Shorin Kobudo Association.

Kumamoto Artpolis: Architecture through Communication

In July and August, the Japan Foundation, Kuala Lumpur organized photo panel exhibition entitled "Kumamoto Artpolis: Architecture through Communication" at two venues. The exhibition features photos of 67 buildings built in Kumamoto prefecture on Kyushu island under the "Kumamoto Artpolis" project initiated by the local government.

The first venue was the Gallerium, Universiti Teknologi Malaysia, and the exhibition was co-organized by Urban Design and Conservation Research Unit (UDCRU), Faculty of Built Environment, Universiti Teknologi Malaysia. It was held for 2 weeks from 20th July to 3rd August and received 1,000 visitors despite the short duration. We would like to thank Prof. Madya Syed Zainol Abidin Idid, his colleagues and students for their kind offer and cooperation towards the exhibition.

The second venue was Galeri Shah Alam, and the exhibition was held from 11th August to 10th September. Besides the exhibition at the main gallery, a talk "Kontemporari Arkitektur di Malaysia" was also held on 30th August. During the duration, a lot of students who study architecture from different universities and colleges visited the gallery. We hope that the concept of this "Kumamoto Artpolis" project as well as the designs of Japanese contemporary architecture has reached the students and it will be beneficial to their further studies on architecture and regional/urban planning.
