Another performance that Japan Foundation Kuala Lumpur (JFKL) is bringing to Malaysia to commemorate the "40th Year of ASEAN-Japan Friendship and Cooperation" is **SOIL & "PIMP" SESSIONS**, a club jazz band from Tokyo. They will be travelling to Malaysia after their first tour in Vietnam.

SOIL & "PIMP" SESSIONS is an explosive Japanese jazz band, comprised of six musicians; trumpet, saxophone, piano, bass, drums plus an uniquely named member called the "agitator". The 6 musicians combine the highest musicianship with the coolest sounds and atmosphere as they perform an original form of aggressive alternative jazz. Their brand of jazz is rough around the edges, unadulterated and described as "constantly kept at boiling point".

Over the years the group has gained recognition for breaking the mold as live pioneers as well as reaching beyond the music genres of rock and jazz. Their Tokyo born fashion and lifestyle is also part of the worldwide fascination.

For the first time here in Malaysia, the group will share stories of how they earned their international reputation, their life stories as professional musicians, and conduct an exclusive master class to music major students.

Shigeri Kitsu has been performing "Minyo" or Japanese folk song since her childhood, and has participated in collaborative performances with artistes from a variety of music genres including pop, jazz and world music. In 1997, she began activities as a solo artist after participating in the 1st World Folk Music Festival in Uzbekistan with her own unique style of playing the drums while singing. She has worked to introduce and spread Minyo & Minyo Drum to the people, and has been actively involved in lectures at universities and workshops for students. She has performed overseas, including tours to Los Angeles in 2002, Indonesia and Singapore in 2003, New York in 2004, Italy and Germany in 2008, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Kazakhstan in 2009 and Shanghai in 2010 and Malaysia in 2011.

JFKL had another traveling exhibition this fiscal year titled "TOHOKU ~ Through the Eyes of Japanese Photographers" showcasing 122 photography works on the TOHOKU region, which was devastated by the earthquake and tsunami on 11th March 2011.

In Klang Valley, the exhibition was held at Galeri Shah Alam from 2nd to 28th November, 2012 together with a screening of 8 documentaries and 1 animation provided by NHK Enterprises.

The venue in Penang was Muzium & Galeri Tuanku Fauziah, Universiti Sains Malaysia. The exhibition there was held from 7th December, 2012 to 5th January, 2013 with the addition of 2 related programs. One of them was a series of talks by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Chong Hon Yew, School of Physics, USM. Dr. Chong explained how earthquakes happen and what happened in the Great Tohoku Earthquake and Tsunami to the participants, with the hope that more people will gain knowledge of the disasters since Penang was one of the places damaged by the Sumatra Earthquake of late 2004.

MGTF also interviewed 4 lecturers at USM who had studied in Japan, and created a video titled "TOHOKU ~ Through the Eyes of Malaysians" which was screened during the exhibition.





Details of Earth Special Public Lecture by Japanese Architect Hiroshi Sambuichi







"Details of Earth", a special public lecture in Kuala Lumpur by one of Japan's top architects, Mr. Hiroshi Sambuichi, was a success. The first lecture held at Lecture Theatre 1, Taylor's University in Lakeside Campus, Subang Jaya on Sunday, 25th November 2012 was attended by almost 300 people including lecturers, students and others. Mr. Sambuchi gave a very powerful and informative lecture that was well received by the audience.

The following day in conjunction with the International Conference of Sustainable Tropical Environmental Design Conference (SusTED 2012), Mr. Sambuichi delivered a lecture at the FRSB Lecture Hall, Faculty of Design and Architecture, at Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM)'s Serdang campus. The conference under the theme of "Climate Change: Solutions by Designs" was officially launched by the Dean of the Faculty. Around 150 people attended the lecture in the morning, which was given a very warm welcome by the audience and staff of the University.

Mr. Sambuichi is one of those forward-looking Japanese architects who are deeply rooted in tradition, but who designs responsible buildings that are strongly influenced by ecology and the nature of their surroundings. His designs reflect the natural beauty of what's around, and uses modern concepts and techniques that create beautiful, traditional, and green structures. His lecture enthralled the audience which responded well by giving comments and posing many questions during the Q&A sessions.

Mr. Timothy Wong Yii Sing, a postgraduate student from Centre for Postgraduate Studies, Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS), was invited to Japan under the JENESYS Special Invitation Programme for Graduate Students from 16th May to 27th June 2012. Under this programme his project research, "Impact of Population Aging on the Economic Growth" was supported by the Japan Foundation.

First of all, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to the Japan Foundation for giving me a golden opportunity to visit Japan. I was truly delighted and happy to have received an invitation from Japan Foundation's JENESYS Programme. I had always wanted to travel to Japan.

16th - 22nd May 2012

(Orientation and Trip to Hiroshima and Kyoto)

The orientation started at the Shinjuku Washington Hotel where I met new friends from 11 different countries. Our trip to Hiroshima and Kyoto was a really fun and unforgettable experience. In Hiroshima, we were welcomed by the Mayor of Hiroshima City. We also visited the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum & Park where we had a chance to listen to an old man who survived the bombing incident. My first experience staying in a *ryokan* (traditional Japanese Hotel) was on Miyashima Island. At the *ryokan*, we were given a chance to wear a *yukata* (a casual summer kimono) and enjoy the *onsen* (hot spring baths). Kyoto is an important cultural

landmark where you can still find Japanese ladies wearing *kimono* and walking on the streets.

23rd - 29th May 2012

(Japanese studies and Cultural experience)

The day before the classes started, we visited the National Diet Library and ended the day with a home visit. We had a wonderful time having dinner with a real Japanese family. It was a great experience studying at Sophia University. After our morning lectures, we took part in cultural experience activities such as *wadaiko* (Japanese traditional drum performance), *Ikebana* (traditional flower arrangement) and *chado* (traditional tea ceremony). It was truly a wonderful experience.

30th May - 27th June 2012

(Individual research, final presentation and farewell)

We were given 19 days to do our research before the final presentation. In our free time during the research period we visited some interesting places around Tokyo such as Akihabara, Yokohama, Ueno, Kamakura, Tokyo Skytree, Tokyo Tower and many more. The final presentations at the Japan Foundation office in Yotsuya ended in success.

Report: Japanese Film Festival in Sarawak

Aside from the annual Japanese Film Festival, which was held in KL and Penang in September, JFKL organized the screening of some exciting films in Kuching & Bintulu, Sarawak, sponsored by Mitsubishi Corporation.

The venue in both cities was Star Cineplex, and we screened 4 titles, namely "YAMAZAKURA – The Cherry Tree in the Hills," "Happy Flight," "Twilight Samurai" and "Departures."
