Message from JFKL Director

Welcome to the Japanese Film Festival 2007!

This annual Japanese films festival is more meaningful this time as it marks one of the main events for this special celebration year 2007. Throughout the year, we proudly present many exciting cultural events inclusive this festival to celebrate the 50th anniversary of Malaysia independence and also of establishment of diplomatic relations between Malaysia and Japan.

The 8 selected films might reflect the recent situation of Japanese film scene, which can be considered as booming. According to the data of last year, over 400 new films were produced in a year. And even more surprising was the audience support for domestic made films are greater than to the foreign films, which had never happened for over 20 years. Hollywood films can hardly get many audiences as before except some big hits in Japanese. Subsequently, new young directors come up with new works one after another and veteran directors produce new films actively. This boom should have something to do with the innovation of technology as well as social and cultural changes in Japan. Number of screens is increasing in accordance with the development of cinema complex. In addition to that, films nowadays are not created only for cinemas. Film producers make money by selling films for other medias such as multi channel TV, DVD, Internet and so on.

In this festival, we have the chance to see a best directing and technique film through "Love and Honor", an authentic film by veteran director Yamada Yoji. Whereas, a popular film "Kamome Diner" by a young new wave film director OGIGAMI Naoko will be very entertaining. My favorite "We Shall Overcome Someday (Pacchigi)" deals with important aspects in Japanese society like culture, history, prejudice and ignorance. It is about friendship between a Japanese boy and a Korean girl. Personally, I am very curious to know how multi cultural society like Malaysian people feels about this film.

To prove one of our objectives to promote Malaysian culture to Japanese people, at the last year's Tokyo International Film Festival, we had invited 9 Malaysian films to be part of the festival. Now the films are on tour around cities in Japan with the hope that local Japanese can gain some knowledge on Malaysian culture, society and lifestyles through the films. Understanding each other is the key for a better tolerance and reverence towards each other.

But when one of his new friends dies in an accident Kosuke realizes the real depth of anti-Japanese feeling among Korean Residents in Japan.




